**Story Summary:** Lucy spends a delightful afternoon with a faun in Narnia, a magical land she discovers quite by accident while exploring the wardrobe in the old Professor's house. Lucy's brother, Edmund, also journeys to Narnia and meets the "Queen of Narnia," an evil white witch who has decreed that it will be forever winter in Narnia. The Queen tricks the young boy into betraying his sisters and brother by offering him a bewitched dessert, called Turkish Delight, and by promising him that he will rule the land with her. When his siblings arrive in Narnia to save the fawn, Edmund betrays Aslan, the great lion of Narnia, into the hands of the white witch. Edmund realizes his grave error and joins in the battle to save Narnia.
